



REDress Installation



Today in the Great Hall, you will find a display of empty red dresses. These dresses serve as a reminder of the many missing and murdered Indigenous women in Canada.

This ongoing tragedy is a lingering result of the damage colonization and the residential schools have wrought on Canada's First Nations Peoples.

We like to think of Canada as a fair and just country, but our early years inflicted significant – and lasting – injustice.

The Anglican Church of Canada began participating formally in Truth and Reconciliation since Archbishop Peers' apology in 1993. This ongoing journey becomes more relevant every year, as noted by Bishop Mark MacDonald:

"Canada is in the process of a bold experiment in reconciliation and much is riding on it. There is a strong and pervasive element of hope that the outcome will be positive and that we will all be better for it. It is not just to right a wrong; not just to make up for what was lost; in many cases, that is not possible, it is to try to make a new society. We seek transformation and not just restoration. This is not to dwell in the past, but to shape a common future that is the place where all will find redemption. This is resurrection work."


