Based in Jönköping, Sweden, their role is to send teams of young Christians into areas where very few people have had the chance to experience the Good News of Jesus, with a special focus on North Africa and the Middle East.

Hello there!

This first year in our four-plus-four year commitment has been all about settling in and finding our feet after moving from Toronto. On the whole it has gone well. After moving three times in the last year we have a place to stay long-term, our children are all speaking Swedish and are doing well in school and our ministry at work is both rewarding and continuing to develop. But it has also been a year of hard things against the backdrop of culture shock. It takes time to make friends, our children miss Canada and we are still looking for a good church home that would suit the whole family.

And yet we have seen again and again that God is faithful. We are already starting to see some fruit:

- Thanks to Susan's work in the application process we are now able to send 10 new missionaries from Sweden overseas. It's the highest number in many years and a real answer to prayer.
- Thanks to Anders, OM Sweden translated and produced 16,000 copies of a prayer guide to be used by Christians during Ramadan. Christians all over the world were praying for their Muslim friends to encounter Jesus and we are starting to hear about answers to prayer.
- We are also on the verge of starting a new church-planting team in the Malmö, Sweden, a very diverse neighbourhood. We already have team members from India and Pakistan ready to share Jesus with the Hindu and Pakistani communities there.
