Pikangikum First Nation and the Winchester Group



For well over 30 years, the Winchester Group has been working with Moorelands Community Services. Flannel blankets, bibs, and knitted booties, sweaters, and receiving blankets, made by the Winchester Group have helped support disadvantaged young mothers and their babies in Toronto.

In 2015, the Winchester Group also started supporting the First Nations Community of Pikangikum by knitting warm winter items for them. Pikangikum is an Ojibwe community of approximately 4,000 people. It is located in northwestern Ontario near the Manitoba border, 700 km north of Thunder Bay. In 2012, Pikangikum was described by Maclean's Magazine as the suicide capital of the world. The majority of these deaths have been the community's young people. Pikangikum has been in the news as of recently due to wildfire evacuations. Our prayers are with the Pikangikum community as well as the fire crews working to ensure the community can return home.

Under the leadership of the Rt. Rev. Mark MacDonald, National Indigenous Anglican Bishop, Anglican parishes including St. Paul's, have been supporting this community. Since 2011 we have helped facilitate the installation of clean running water in over 20 homes. Families have voiced their gratitude for this support by saying they can finally keep their children clean and free from skin infections. To date, approximately 600 mitts, scarves, and toques have travelled north to be received by young families.

Weekly meetings of the Winchester Group consist of knitting, sewing, worship, and fellowship – community within the context of Christian service by women doing what they can to support great need in our city and in Pikangikum. Get involved when the Winchester Group resumes weekly meetings in September. New members are always welcome.
