Palm Sunday

Holy Week begins **today** with Palm Sunday or the Passion of Our Lord. We commemorate the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem. It is customary to have a blessing of palm leaves which includes the reading of a Gospel account of how Jesus rode into Jerusalem humbly on a donkey, and how people placed palms on the ground in front of him. Immediately following this great time of celebration, Jesus begins his journey to the Cross.

Maundy Thursday

This service commemorates the Last Supper of Jesus with his Twelve Apostles, the institution of the Eucharist or Holy Communion. At the end of the service, silence reigns. All removable furnishings or decorations are removed. The lights are dimmed, the music is funeral in tone and then silence, the silence of Good Friday. Join us for our Maundy Thursday service on **April 13 at 7 p.m.**

Good Friday

The Good Friday service involves the reading of the Passion account from the Gospel of Mark, read dramatically, with eight different readers, and the congregation all taking part. The service concludes with the Solemn Intercession, a very focused and powerful

prayer that keeps our eyes, minds and hearts focused on the Cross. The Church mourns for Christ's death, reveres the Cross, and marvels at his life. Join us for our Good Friday Service on **April 14 at 11 a.m.**

Journey to the Cross for Children and Youth

On Good Friday we invite children and youth to experience Easter like one of Jesus' first disciples. The children will pick up a passport and go on a guided tour around the building to visit some amazing places. Our youth will be in costume to host each stop on the journey. From the donkey they encounter at the beginning of the tour to the empty tomb at the close, the journey will tell the story of Jesus' death and resurrection. Join us in the **Dalton Room (second floor) at 10:45 a.m.** to meet your Tour Group! Everyone is welcome to join us. Childcare is available for children three and under.



Easter Sunday, which immediately follows Holy Week, is the great feast day and culmination of the Christian Church year for on this day the Resurrection of Jesus Christ is celebrated. It is the first day of the new season of the Great Fifty Days, or Eastertide, which runs from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday (June 4). Easter Sunday is the main reason why Christians keep Sunday as the primary day of religious observance. Join us on **April 16 at 8:15 a.m., 9:30 a.m. and 11 a.m.** as we celebrate Easter Sunday.

Easter for Children and Youth

Children and youth are invited to celebrate with their families and the St. Paul's community in church. During the service children up to Grade 5 will be invited to come to the Children's Ministry area to learn more about Easter. We will bring the children back to their parents in church just before communion time. Join us for a large indoor Easter egg hunt after both the 9:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. services. Meet at the bottom of the stairs in the foyer to start the hunt. Over 1,200 Easter eggs will be hiding throughout the building. Childcare is available for children three and under during our services.
